Grants are divided up into the following four categories: Education; Community; Health; Social welfare. Trustees are strong believers that every community needs a focus on which to build the cohesion of that community and they are therefore advocates of the 'village hall', particularly in isolated rural areas where facilities are often very limited. Types of projects that will be considered are: new builds, refurbishment and improvements of village halls, scout huts, youth clubs, community centres and similar (this often includes access for the disabled, modernising kitchens, new storage space and updating toilets in line with Health and Safety regulations and the Disability Discrimination Act); equipment; specialised transport; and IT. Applications are open all year round.

Community Service Grants

The key elements of grassroots change and support comes from community programmes and those charities that work within these areas trying to make living spaces better and more inclusive for those who are living there.

Awards for All

Awards for All offers grants of between £300 and £10,000 for grassroots and community activity that aims to improve life for local people and neighbourhoods. It doesn't have a deadline and you can apply at any time. It is the most popular grants programme so they will prioritise groups with smaller incomes. Due to high demand on the programme, organisations that have a large annual income may not be able to get funding through Awards for All. It is recommended that you send your application at least four months before you want your project to start.

There is very clear criteria as to what they can and cannot fund and how they are prioritised. You can apply to Awards for All England if you are a community or not-for-profit group, parish or town council, health body, or school. You do not need to be a registered charity to apply. You must have a bank account that requires at least two people to sign each cheque or withdrawal.

Community 360

Grants of up to £100,000 Available for Community Facilities (England) - Community360 (England)

Registered charities, churches, parish councils, local authorities and CASC registered sports clubs can apply for grants of between £2,000 and £100,000 for the provision, maintenance or improvement of community facilities. This can include village halls and community centres, public play areas; publicly available multi use games areas, skate parks and BMX tracks; sport and recreation grounds including pavilions and clubhouses with full public access; churches – community spaces only; nature reserves; public gardens, parks, country parks and woodlands with at least dawn to dusk access; and Museums. The funding is being made available through the FCC Community Action Fund and is available to projects located within 10 miles of an eligible FCC Environment site. Round 4 of the Community Action Fund will open for applications on the 15th September 2021 and close at 5 pm on the 1st December 2021.

Grants to build resilient communities through nature (Wales)

Grants to Build Resilient Communities through Nature (Wales) - News - Grants Online

Public, private and charitable sector organisations, higher education institutions, research institutes and individuals, can apply for a share of £2 million in funding for projects that increase community participation with nature to help build resilient communities across Wales.

Grants of up to £250,000 are available for projects lasting up to two years. The funding will help deliver projects that give people opportunities for:

- · Improved mental and physical health
- · Learning new skills
- · Being part of safer communities
- · More access to nature
- · A better awareness of the impact of climate change
- Involvement in making decisions about their natural environment
- Participation in citizen science

Projects will need to address one or more of the opportunities or priorities described in the relevant:

- Natural Resources Wales <u>Area Statement</u>
- Public Services Boards' wellbeing plans (futuregenerations.wales)

Natural Resources Wales will share the £2m funding equally across the seven areas of Wales described in our Area Statements: £1m in 2022/23 and £1m in 2023/24.

The funding is being made available through the Natural Resources Wales Resilient Communities Grant which closes to applications at 12pm on the 19th September.
